

Flea Allergy Dermatitis

Flea Allergy Dermatitis (FAD) is essentially flea bite hypersensitivity. Cats with flea allergies can suffer from intense itchiness after just one flea bite. This extreme reaction is an allergic response to the flea's saliva, which is injected into your cat's skin during a flea bite.

Look for signs of FAD in your cat.

Cats with flea allergies have constant, intense scratching and will even chew and lick themselves where they're infected.

Prevention is the most important treatment for Flea Allergy Dermatitis.



Fleas are present year-round, even in colder climates. Fleas love the warmth of your home in winter as much as you do. One adult flea can lay up to 50 eggs per day.

Eggs fall onto your carpet and furniture, where they hatch and find your feline family.

Larvae live in dirt, debris and dark places.

Pupae live within silk-like cocoons. They can live for up to 12 months before emerging to impact your home and cats.

How to Open

Remove inner tray from carton. Firmly grasp one tube and pull away from tray. Hold tube firmly in one hand. With the other hand, push down firmly on the cap and turn counter clockwise (to the left). Continue twisting cap until it comes off the tube. Turn the cap around and place opposite end of cap back on tube. Twist cap to break seal. Remove cap from tube.

How to Apply

- Position the tip of the tube on the cat's back between the shoulder blades.
- Use the tip of the tube to part the cat's hair so that the product will be applied at skin level.
- **3** Squeeze tube, applying entire contents in a single spot on the cat's skin.

Separate treated cat from other pets for 24 hours after treatment has been applied. Do not allow your cat to ingest this product or get the product into their eyes. Proper placement of the product on your cat will minimize the opportunity for the cat to lick and ingest the product. Carefully avoid allowing the product to run off the side of the cat. Discard empty tube and packaging as described in the Storage and Disposal section of product insert. Apply monthly for optimal control and prevention of fleas.

FACTS ON

- Indoor cats need protection too. Adult fleas like to come inside your home on people's shoes or clothing without you even knowing it.
- ◆ Even cats who are the most effective self-groomers can fall victim to fleas. Check behind your cat's head, along their back, and in the tummy area regularly.
- Fleas also like to hang out in your home in places like rugs and carpets, bedding, clothes, furniture, and pet beds.
